



MITCH GRAINGER



Mitch Grainger infuses the Blues & Roots genre's traditional stylings with a confidence, and depth of spirit, that has seen him compared to the likes of Robert Johnson by American music critics.

No overnight sensation, this accolade came after over 25 years of performing and recording, predominantly as a side-man with some of Australia and the world's greatest blues and blues-rock artists.

Beginning his career at just age fourteen, playing harmonica and guitar in the bars of Balmain in Sydney, Mitch Grainger spent his

teens honing his craft as a side-man, by jamming with fellow high schoolmates CW Stoneking and Alex Lloyd before joining The Bondi Cigars, who he toured every inch of Australia with before he had turned twenty-one.

Balmain was fertile ground, and if not for being born here, Mitch's life may have taken a totally different path. One night at The Bridge Hotel in Balmain, Malcolm Young of AC/DC who also lived in the area, walked in and saw Mitch Grainger playing, this led to a long-term friendship and the introduction of Mitch to the Albert's productions family and one of Malcolm's mentors, the legendary Australian producer Harry Vanda, whom Grainger made a deal with for the Australian release of his album *Love and Demons* in 2006.

Mitch's depth of understanding of the genre and his charismatic stage show immediately thrust him onto the wider blues & roots scene. He packed houses in Australia and Scandinavia, performed at prestigious festivals, such as the American Folk Alliance in Kansas City, and earned standing ovations while opening for Tommy Emmanuel across the North East of the USA.

Then, come 2017, while looking for more of an electric sound, Mitch disappeared, turned recluse, and focused on inventing, patenting and Kick-starting a revolutionary new harmonica microphone called Dyna-Mic, which would enable him to play harmonica hands free, in an electric band setting.

This new harmonica microphone is now used by 100s of harmonica players around the globe, and notably was used by Bob Dylan on his 2018 New Zealand Tour.

ENRICO GRANAFEI



Harmonica player, guitarist, and vocalist Enrico Granafei has explored many different types of music during his career. Enrico has a degree in classical guitar from the Conservatory of l'Aquila, Italy and a master's degree in jazz performance from the Manhattan School of Music where he was the only student of Toots Thielemans.

Enrico discovered the Hands Free Chromatic harmonica when he met Vern Smith, the inventor of this innovative device. Since then, playing in this solo situation has become his mission. Aware of the fact that this type of coordination was never explored before at this advanced level, Enrico has spent the last couple of decades perfecting this unique and innovative technique.

From straight ahead jazz to bossa nova to funk, Enrico does it all, making you think that it's two or three people playing.

Charlie Musselwhite says of Rubin, "I think your instructions are the best. When someone asks me about learning harmonica, I send them to you."



WINSLOW YERXA'S GANG OF EIGHT



WInslow applies his colorful imagination to all sorts of harmonicas and topics, as you'll hear in his Thursday afternoon concert set. Entertainment director Paul Davies posed Winslow two challenges: include bass and chord harmonicas, and play at least one number on a Hohner PentaHarp. You'll hear bass and chord harmonicas (played by Boaz Kim and AJ Windmeyer respectively) on all songs, integrated into an ensemble with guitar (Eric Noden), drums (Michael Bremo), bass (Stephen Schultz), and two backing vocalists (Brenda Freed and Carolyn Dolan). PentaHarp, too, along with diatonic, chromatic and Bushman GameChanger/JDR Trochilus.

Well known as the author of *Harmonica For Dummies* and *Blues Harmonica For Dummies*, Winslow rarely exhibits his harmonica fluency as soloist, so this is a not-to-be-missed opportunity.

ROSEBUSH YOUTH SHOWCASE

Perseus Morgan is a recent graduate of Leeds Conservatoire in England and has been playing the harmonica since he was 13. He is well versed in many styles of music, mainly classical/Baroque, early music, traditional Irish music, and blues.

From Katarokwi/Kingston, Canada, 19-year-old Sam Coons was influenced by Neil Young to pick up diatonic harmonica. Thanks to blues players like James Cotton, they started taking the instrument more seriously and became obsessed after finding Brendan Power's inventions online. They now enjoy playing bluegrass, jazz, blues, and funk on any kind of harmonica they can get their hands on and experimenting with different tunings and setups.

Jackson Baker is a 21-year-old blues player from Pennsylvania. Although he was exposed to blues through his father, a big fan, he didn't start to really listen to it until high school. After hearing a few tracks by harmonica players like James Cotton and Sonny Boy Williamson II, Jackson decided to pick up the harp. After that it became an addiction, and he couldn't stop listening and playing to the music of all the great harp players.

Hayden Everding is a 19-year-old harmonica player from Dayton, Ohio. He began playing harmonica during a backpacking trip in New Mexico. He performed onstage for the first time at age 15. Since then, the blues bug has stayed with him.

Hot, swingin, smooth, original, clean, lyrical, faster than a speeding bullet, diatonically chromatic, one of a kind, masterful, the swinginest, Oh yeah, like what? Nat King Cole, Benny Goodman, Louie Jordan, Ben Webster, Sweets Edison... that's what!

With six solo albums under his belt, including his double-Grammy nominated 2011 release, 2 Days Out and A Madness To The Method, PT Gazell continues to expand the musical boundaries for the harmonica. Using his

own signature model instrument, the PT Gazell Model 1847 Noble, he proves that the harmonica is capable of much more than what most of us believe.

PT likes to think of his performances and musical projects as an ongoing conversation between himself and his fans. Judging by the music he delivers, he's quite a compelling and articulate speaker.

No other player combines his phrasing, his melodic style, his song choices and his improvisational abilities... his singular style may draw comparisons to others, but in the end, it's a style all his own.

Cheryl sizzles with excitement as she mesmerizes audiences with her sultry voice and powerhouse energy. She is a triple threat: a great songwriter, vocalist, and blows harp like there's no tomorrow. Hailing from Boston. Massachusetts she began playing harmonica and immersing herself into the blues in

1987. Her earliest childhood memories relating to music were listening to and singing along with her mother's Louis Armstrong and Billie Holiday records. Her true passion, though, was learning to play an instrument, and at age 8 her grandmother set her up with accordion lessons—not exactly what she had in mind, but it was a start and led to playing other instruments like guitar and bass, eventually finding the one instrument that truly resonated with her—the harmonica.

In her 30+ year career, Cheryl has toured regionally, nationally, and abroad with her own band as well as sharing the stage with many well-known blues artists such as Jr. Wells, R. L. Burnside, Honeyboy Edwards, Charlie Musselwhite, James Cotton, Duke Robillard, Louisiana Red, Lazy Lester, Johnny Clyde Copeland, Pinetop Perkins, Luther "Guitar Jr." Johnson, Ronnie Earl, Junior Watson, Big Bill Morganfield, Johnny Rawls, Anson Funderburgh, Sam Myers & more...

Cheryl has recorded several CDs, with her most critically acclaimed being *Blues Got Me*, a 13 track CD with seven original songs and a stellar seven piece band produced by Duke Robillard who also plays on a few cuts.

In 2001 Cheryl started sharing her gift and passion for harmonica with others by teaching lessons privately and in group workshops. She currently runs "The Harmonica Experience," a five day workshop that's held twice a year in May & September down at the Shack Up Inn, Clarksdale Mississippi. www.theharmonicaexperience.com







THE ABC TRIO

AJ Windmeyer started playing chord after receiving his first chord harmonica as a Christmas gift in 2010 from the Harmonica Hotshots, Al and Judy Smith. Over the last 10 years, AJ has experimented with playing chord harmonica for several years under the influence of many great chord players including Tony Sgro, Al Smith, Eddie Gordon, Al Fiore, Harry Halicki (late chord player for the Philharmonica Trio), Manny Smith (late chord player for the Stagg McMann Trio), and Joe Mass Jr (late chord player of the Generation Gap), to create a style of playing that is both unique, but similar to those before his time. AJ also regularly plays all the other styles of harmonicas: the chromatic, the bass harmonica, the Polyphonia, the Harmonetta, as well as diatonic. AJ is also an endorsee of EastTop Harmonicas as a chord harmonica player.

Phil Caltabellotta is a chromatic harmonica master who has and can play everything from classical to jazz, standards, blues, and pop music. He has played with some of the best harmonica ensembles throughout the years. He has performed in Singapore, Malaysia, and throughout the United States, including at Lehigh and Howard University. In 2012, Phil won the Bernie Bray award. Recently, Mo Vint's Harmonicats performed in Florida with Phil helping out playing the chord harmonica.

Boaz Kim is a music teacher and studio musician from Philadelphia, PA. His middle school years were so heavily into learning how to play and bend on diatonic harmonica with very little learning resources available to him, that he was eventually able to obtain all of the available bends. After taking a 7 year break from the diatonic harmonica, Boaz dug out all of his diatonics and relearned to play in the practice rooms of West Chester University while completing his music education degree.

After graduating with a BM in Music Education, Boaz has been performing with different bands and recording in several studios in the tri-state area, while teaching in several music schools. He has added the chromatic, bass, 48 chord, and polyphonia harmonicas to his quiver which he has since gained proficiency on each type leading to music that goes outside of the classic harmonica trio sound. He currently maintains his own music studio teaching harmonica, voice, and piano. Boaz also repairs and customizes them for players all over the world and has collaborated with some of the world's leading technicians. He has most recently taken on repairing the difficult Harmonetta.

Boaz is endorsed by Hohner Music and uses their harmonicas exclusively.

STEVE BAKER



Born in London, England and resident in Germany, Steve Baker has long been regarded as one of the great harmonica artists, with an impressive reputation as a player, teacher, author, and long-term consultant to the Hohner company. A full time professional since the late 1970s, his rhythmically accented phrasing and rich command of timbre and tone have helped him create a unique sound which has influenced harmonica players around the world. Drawing on the blues harmonica tradition, he combines

it with elements from country, folk, funk, soul and jazz to create an exciting and individual fusion which transcends stylistic boundaries while sounding totally natural.

In his lengthy career as a sideman, he has worked with a wide range of artists including first generation rock&roller Tony Sheridan, the late great Chris Jones (with whom he released four highly regarded CDs) and European blues legend Abi Wallenstein, as well as playing on countless studio productions as a session musician. In 2017 Steve began recording and performing his own songs and has now released a total of three albums of original music on Timezone Records: *Perfect Getaway* (2018), *The Great Divide* (2020), and *Too Much Is Never Enough* (2023)

Catchy and vibrant, his compositions incorporate a wide range of stylistic elements ranging from blues and Americana to rock, funk and even reggae. They combine a melodic pop sensibility with thought-provoking, well-crafted lyrics, delivered with the energy and intensity that has always characterized his work.

Ever in the service of the song, Steve Baker's funky, melodic and elegant harmonica style is instantly recognizable, forming a perfect foil to his voice. With his latest album *Too Much Is Never Enough*, he steps back to his acoustic roots, creating compositions that sound both totally familiar as well as fresh and original.

HANK SHREVE

Hank Shreve began playing harmonica at the age of 8 and has established himself as a major harmonica talent on the blues scene in the Pacific Northwest. Between the ages of 8 and 18, he became proficient on other instruments such as drums, keyboards, guitar, dobro, lap steel, and vocals.

Hank won the Northwest Harmonica Championship in 2008 and CBA's Muddy Award for Best Harmonica in 2009 and 2013. Also, Hank won the 2021 Rooster Blues



Award for Best Male Vocalist. Hank has performed at the Las Vegas Big Blues Bender, The Waterfront Blues Festival, Toronto Jazz Festival, the Cognac Blues Passions Fest in France with Karen Lovely, and Seattle's BumperShoot with Magic Dick and Lee Oskar. In November 2018, Hank was a featured artist and teacher in the Jason Ricci/Winslow Yerxa Harmonica Collective in New Orleans, along with John Nemeth and Rick Estrin.

Hank has shared the stage with Honeyboy Edwards, Smash Mouth, Merle Haggard, Norton Buffalo, Gregg Rolie, Marcia Ball, Sista Monica Parker, Amy Clawson & Pam Tillis, Terry Robb, Magic Dick, Lee Oskar, The Fabulous Thunderbirds, Karen Lovely, Deanna Bogart, Roger Fisher (from Heart), Curtis Salgado, DK Stewart, Johnny Dyer, Lloyd Jones, Paul deLay, RJ Mischo, CJ Chenier, Aki Kumar, Jim Belushi, and many other national and international acts.

Apart from being one of Eugene, Oregon's beloved musicians, Hank is also a music instructor. He currently teaches online classes through Music Masters in South Eugene. He teaches harmonica, drums, guitar, lap steel, piano, and music fundamentals. He also is a contributor to the Tomlin Harmonica School, as well as Ronnie Shellist's Global Harmonica Summits.

Hank is endorsed by Hohner Harmonicas, Blows Me Away Productions, and the Lone Wolf Blues Company.

Over the years, this show has become a popular Gospel venue, offering a reflection on the week's activities at SPAH, enjoyment of the harmonica and thankfulness for the camaraderie of this wonderful harmonica community. THE CHRIS BAUER JAZZ VARIET **HOUR**

Downbeat Magazine proclaimed Chris Bauer "is an excellent harmonica player...with a free sense of swing and joy." Residing in northern Connecticut, Chris performs popular jazz standards on the chromatic harmonica with a repertoire from upbeat bop tunes to cool Latin numbers to soulful ballads. Playing harmonica for over 50 years, his performance and recording experiences are diverse including jazz gigs, harmonica trios, church worship bands, production library tracks, even recording "Mack the Knife" with a reggae band! He performs and gives harmonica technique seminars at many festivals around the country. His CD In A Yuletide Groove has been featured on numerous jazz radio stations around the country, and was declared as "a solidly delightful mainstream take on holiday classics that makes you smile from start to finish," by Chris Spector of Midwest Record.

Born and raised on New York's Long Island, Chris was surrounded by the harmonica since his chord playing father, Bob Bauer, had a harmonica trio of his own called the Harmonikings. He started playing at age nine and began appearing with his father's trio by thirteen. At sixteen, Chris placed third in a worldwide harmonica competition and in 1987, placed fourth in a field of 27 chromatic harmonica soloists at the International Harmonica Federation competition. In both competitions, he was the highest placed American chromatic harmonica player. Since then, Chris has performed at many venues including B.B. Kings in NY (guest artist with Dickey Betts), Shanghai Jazz in Madison NJ, and also the harmonica role in the play Big River.

Chris has often performed at SPAH as a jazz soloist, in a harmonica trio, and with the SPAH Big Band. He is also one of the chromatic harmonica tutors in Joe Filisko's Teach-In.

ANTONIO SERRANO



Antonio Serrano is a harmonica virtuoso, a reference model in contemporary Spanish jazz and one of the most requested session musicians. Serrano exercises a great versatility that shows in his long history of musical collaborations. He seems to feel at ease in musical fields as distant from each other as jazz, flamenco, pop, and classical.

At age 13 he played at a United Nations event in Paris, duetting with Larry Adler. This feat marked the beginning of a long

relationship that boosted Antonio's already promising career. Adler became his mentor and they went on to play together countless times.

Having focused mainly on classical music, Antonio eventually started exploring other genres. He began playing with blues, jazz, and pop acts and was soon recognized to be one of the best Spanish improvisers of his generation. To date, he has participated in hundreds of album sessions in every musical style.

After becoming known as a harmonica virtuoso, it was inevitable that he would receive the call from the most important Spanish guitarist of all time: flamenco guitarist Paco de Lucía. Eventually, Antonio Serrano became known for introducing the harmonica in flamenco, a musical genre that is practically inaccessible for musicians not born into flamenco. He became a member of Paco de Lucía's band during his last 10 years of life and went on 8 world tours with him.

His teaching activity includes music improvisation courses at several European conservatories and flamenco courses at Berklee College of Music. He has also taught at the University of Khartoum and participated as a jury member at harmonica contests in Germany, Taiwan, and South Korea.

Antonio Serrano's own discography comprises a total of 12 albums. *HARMONIOUS*, his first solo work, is a retrospective of his career in which he performs his own material as well as covers of songs that have been important in his musical development.

Another aspect has been getting the company involved with leading harmonica customizers and and setting up the Hohner Affiliated Customizer program. More recent developments include the Rocket series and the HB-52 Harp Blaster microphone. I've also been closely involved with harmonica education and organizing harmonica festivals including the World Harmonica Festivals and Harmonica Masters Workshops in Trossingen. Your

They also have these scales configured in a linear fashion for ease of playability and a smooth, legato sound. Pentatonic I-IV is a rich tuning capable of playing many things well. It is unparalleled for playing pentatonic/blues scales. I have made some brief videos to demonstrate these harmonicas, available at magic-harmonicas.com.

The Art & Importance of Listening Joost Jansen

Designed to raise awareness among participants about the often overlooked but essential art of listening, both before, during, and after playing. Listening is the key to becoming a better harmonica player. First, we'll explore the lack of attention given to listening in the musical world. Often, people get caught up in learning specific licks and mechanically playing

them without fully understanding the nuances and subtleties of the sound. Here, I lay the groundwork: listening to music is not just a passive act but an active art. I share insights into what to pay attention to when listening to music. We'll focus on details ranging from pitch and rhythm to expression and emotion and discover the deeper lavers of music and enrich their own playing. Tasteful and Skillful Accompaniment Techniques for Blues Players

We will explore and recreate all the incredible things one can do on the diatonic harmonica with chords (rhythmic chordal patterns), Rhythmic Tongue Blocking
Techniques, and simple repeated riffs on the harmonica that will add to the overall sound when someone else in the band is playing, soloing, or even singing. This will primarily focus on Blues and explore the idea that one should be adding to the sound and playing AT ALL TIMES when on the stage. Use of dynamics, both rhythmic and non rhythmic chording, the breath pulse, the tone pulse, rhythmic vamping, and simple fills will all be covered.

Tremolo for Diatonic Players

While the tremolo is mostly played in Asia, the accordion style tremolo sound also fits Irish, Cajun and other styles. With two rows of closely spaced holes, it looks daunting for 10 hole diatonic players. However, despite the different appearances, the layout for both instruments is similar. We look at the Asian style tremolo, how it is tuned, how it is played. Then we consider how 10 hole diatonic players can transfer their existing skills to the tremolo.
